Speech Pathology Update

Dear Parents and Carers,

Speech Pathologists in Schools Newsflash
Reading Together Every Day
Reading is a great activity for all children.

Your child does not need to be able to read words by themselves to enjoy a book.

Reading together can help children:

- 🦟 Listen to words and sounds.
- 🗣️ Learn and practise words.
- 👁️ Look at pictures and words.
- 🧠 Understand stories and information.
- 😊 Enjoy time with you.
- ❤️ Feel calm, happy and connected.
- .

Even 10–15 minutes of reading each day can be helpful.

How Can I Read With My Child?

1. Choose a Book

Choose a book that your child likes.

It can be:

- A picture book.
- A favourite story.
- A book about animals or cars.
- A book about their favourite topic.
- A simple magazine.
- A recipe.
- A song or nursery rhyme.

Let your child choose when possible.

2. Look at the Pictures

Before reading, look at the pictures together.

You can say:

- "Look!"
- "What can you see?"
- "It's a dog!"
- "Where is the car?"

Your child can point, look, touch, gesture, use AAC, make a sound or say a word to show you what they see.

3. Read Aloud

Read the book to your child.

Use a slow and clear voice.

Point to the pictures and important words.

You can repeat words and phrases.
